PM hears of Shell's progress in T&T

Prime Minister's Dr Keith Rowley yesterday heard of the progress Royal Dutch Shell had made to increase its natural gas production out of the Starfish field and work that is "ongoing aimed at ensuring continued and increased production."

Rowley and his team visited Shell's Woodcreek Campus in Houston yesterday and according to a release from the Office of the Prime Minister, Rowley engaged with Shell executives for a follow-up on discussions held last week during a visit to Shell's offices in The Hague and Amsterdam.

Among the executives with whom Rowley and his delegation met were Executive Vice Presi-

dent of Shell's Integrated Gas Venture business, De La Rey Venter, Vice President and Country Chairman of Shell T&T Derek Hudson, and Chief Operating Officer Shell

T&T Eugene Okpere.

Presentations made during this working visit highlighted the significant increase in gas production from the Starfish field. The company faced challenges, after the initial Starfish start-up did not produce as first anticipated.

The presentations also focused on Shell's assets in the East and North Coast Marine Area, exploration, near-term and delivered projects.
